Head Teacher's Remarks

Happy New Year! I do hope that you all enjoyed a wonderful time over the festive season with your children. It was lovely to welcome them back to school last Thursday and to hear all about their holidays. They were all very excited by the gifts they had received. The children have been sharing with me some great work over the past seven days.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

Composition:

The Representative Parent Group (RPG) is comprised of a volunteer non-elected group of parents whose children are of ages such that the full age range of the school is represented.

Mandate:

The group offer a valuable opportunity for the Head Teacher and a representative from the Governing Body to discuss and receive direct parent comment on issues to be determined by the Head Teacher and Governing Body. This comment will feed into the School Development Plan where appropriate.

Protocols:

Meetings are held termly or half-termly dependent on the requirement of issues to be discussed.

Meeting format is group discussion in small groups to be followed by whole RPG feedback session to the Head Teacher.

It is appropriate for the RPG to share any "playground conversation concerns" with the Head Teacher to ensure communication is a two-way process. However, it is important that the normal parent-school communications routes are not disregarded.

Questions which arise between meetings can be e-mailed to the Group who will respond by e-mail to the Head Teacher.

Confidentiality:

All discussion items and shared information may be discussed with the wider parent body unless specified by the Head Teacher that they should be treated in confidence.
