GOVERNOR NEWS

I would like to thank all the parents that completed the Governors parents survey as well as the Ofsted Parent View survey ahead of the Inspectors visit last term. We also appreciate the time taken by parents to leave comments on our survey about various aspects of school life which we have found very useful. The number of replies to our survey was lower than previous years but off the back of the Ofsted survey it was understandable. We have therefore used the results from both surveys to determine those areas when we need to following up and understand better and those areas where the school can be rightly proud of itself. There has been a lot of data to digest this year and as a result this reply is later than planned.

We are very pleased to see that the school continues to score very highly in the areas concerning your children's enjoyment and well being at school. These included the questions concerning

My child is happy My child enjoys school My child feels safe My child is taught to have respect for others My child is well looked after Children are well behaved

It was noted at the Ofsted visit that you did not think that the school dealt effectively with bullying and this was backed up by your replies to the relevant question in both our survey and Ofsted. I have reported back to you in this area before but I wanted to confirm that we as a Governing Body have spoken to the school on a number of occasions and the procedures and processes that are in place are robust and consistently applied when necessary. We consider that perhaps the problem is that it is not always clear to parents when the school starts a process and due to confidentiality, the school cannot disclose the outcomes. What we do appreciate from the survey results is that even though some parents disagreed with the systems or the process those same parents were able to score the school highly in the questions regarding the enjoyment and safety of their children. This suggests that the procedures and processes that the school applies albeit, perhaps invisibly, were effective and issues were resolved.

Communication is a big area where you feel the school can do better. This was shown in the answers to questions regarding

I receive valuable information about my child's progress Staff explain how I can continue my child's education at home The school communicates with parents well The school encourages parents to play an active role The replies received for communication questions were not all bad but they did divide opinion amongst the parent body with a wide range of results from strongly agree to strongly disagree. There were a sufficient mix of replies to highlight this as a focus area for the Governing Body and we are discussing this in earnest with the school. We are looking at the Joinos system of communicating with you as we know it could be better. We also are aware that short notice communication could be significantly better and the school is looking at various ways that this could be improved. As a Governing Body we have a Marketing and Communications Committee which is tasked with working with the school in this area. I am hopeful that we will see improvements in this area in the near future.

We found the comments left on our survey very useful and they highlight other areas where communication is key. Comments were made concerning the emotional well being of pupils. This initially surprised us as we know from our school visits that there are a number of lessons geared around confidence and emotional wellbeing and associated matters. We think that as parents you may not be fully aware of what the school does during various lessons and special focus events to help children in this area. Certainly all children have lessons around confidence and well being. Hopefully this is one of the reasons you were able to score the children so highly on the questions about behaviour and respect for others. We are also aware that help is available for any pupils that need further assistance in these areas so please contact your child's teacher is you want to discuss this further.

Lastly I would like to comment on your interest for out of school clubs. We have spoke to the school regarding this. Certain clubs are currently run by the staff in their own time after school. There is no scope for the staff to run further clubs. The school office have previously made enquiries of outside businesses that were interested in running clubs however their charges and requirements were deemed to be prohibitive or un-workable. I have asked the school to keep this under review and we have considered it as part of the planning for next year. If any of you know of any groups or individuals that are able to run after-school clubs or breakfast clubs then feel free to let the school know.

I would like to finish by thanking you all again and may I encourage you to complete our next survey when it comes out in the spring as it is a very useful way to measure how we are doing. In the meantime if any parent wishes to be more involved there are regular Representative Parent Group meetings at which members of the school leadership team and the Governing Body are present to discuss new ideas and report back on proposed and potential changes.
