Head Teacher's Remarks

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We are almost at the end of the year, and this week has again been very busy in school. KS2 production on Monday and Tuesday evenings was a real highlight – the children were all amazing, and the acting talent from Y6 was lovely to see. I am sure that all parents, relatives and friends who were able to see one of the performances enjoyed the show, and could not fail to be impressed with the standard shown. Well done to all of KS2!

Y6 enjoyed a special visit to Chessington World of Adventure on Wednesday – a celebration of the end of their time at Cheddington. Today they have each received a new bible to take on with them through their secondary education. We are very grateful to Bibles for Children who have sponsored this for our school. Y2 travelled back in time to the early days of our school in their Victorian day yesterday. Mrs Williams looked suitably stern as a Victorian school mistress, and they were visited by the 'Vicar's wife' and 'Lady Rosebery'. The children enjoyed a most interesting day, and looked the part too.

The new core strength and balance equipment is now open for the children – who are rather excited! Our new cycle and scooter park has already seen a marked increase in the number of children who are cycling/scooting to school. We are delighted that the installation went so smoothly and the children are able to benefit from this before the summer.

Sadly late last night some uninvited visitors from the local area came onto the school site and damaged some of YR outdoor classroom and parts of the sensory garden. A local resident sent a photograph to highlight some very inconsiderate parking that could have put residents at risk. There was barely room for a car to pass between two parked vehicles, let alone the emergency services. The school has contacted the Police about this matter, and we would again ask parents to use the park and walk facilities at the Village Hall/recreation ground whenever possible. If you have to park nearer to the school, then please could you do so with due consideration for the local residents. Thank you.

Thank you to all those parents who have already returned the report acknowledgement slips, and for your responses. If you have not yet acknowledged receipt of your child's report, please could you do so on Monday – the deadline was today and we are still missing at least 60% of the slips! Thank you – and do remember that this is as we are legally required to have your signature to prove you have received the report.
