Head Teacher's Remarks

Welcome back to the last part of the summer term. At least in name it is summer term though this week certainly does not have a summer feel! Thankfully last week Y6 had much better weather for their visit to the River Dart Centre. They had a fantastic week, and challenged themselves to overcome fears and apprehensions. They all seem to have returned back taller and even more self-assured.

On Monday this week Y4 and Y5 enjoyed a visit to the new Science Oxford centre. We were one of the invited schools to be able to visit this term following its recent opening. The children loved their learning there and came back full of all the things they had seen. On Tuesday we were visited by one of the archaeologists who excavated prior to the new building commencing in the village. She took a whole school assembly before spending time with Y6. Again the children were fascinated. Y6 have had a particularly busy week as yesterday they enjoyed a visit by a magistrate and a barrister; and today have a Maya day with an expert sharing her knowledge with them.

I am delighted to share with you all that four of our Y6 girls have been selected as finalists in the Big Science Event Investigation Competition run by Science Oxford. A large number of schools in Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire take part in this, with each small group within each class producing a poster on their investigation. These are all judged with the top twelve across all entries being finalists. This is a huge achievement and we are justly proud of the girls.

In light of the above paragraph please note that we have had to move the KS2 production afternoon performance from Friday 5th July to Thursday 4th July, as the finals are held in Oxford on the 5th. Good luck girls! We are aware that for some families child care can be a real issue, so we would like to include younger siblings in the audience for the Thursday afternoon performance. The evening performances will remain for adults and older children only. We hope that this will make it easier for families to support our KS2 children and enjoy the production.

We would like to invite all parents and grandparents who can attend to join us for Sports Day on Monday 24th June weather permitting. (If Monday is too inclement then Sports Day will be held on the Wednesday.) Key Stage 1 will be in the morning, starting at 10:00am; with Key Stage 2 starting at 1:30pm in the afternoon. If you wish to bring a picnic chair or rug that would be welcomed as we have limited seating. Please also feel free to bring some refreshments for yourselves if you wish. (The children will have their usual snack and water bottle, so will not require anything additional.) We do hope that you will be able to join us. The rest of our Sports Week offers a range of special opportunities for the children – I am sure it will be a great week as usual.

I would like to invite Year 5 parents to a meeting about secondary school transfer arrangements for 2020 entry to Y7, and the associated transfer test should you wish your child to take this. The meeting will be in the school hall on Wednesday 3rd July at 7:00pm and I do hope you will be able to attend. I look forward to sharing the information with you.

As you will see later in this newsletter, we are inviting the children to dress down on Friday 5th July in return for a donation of a bottle or a toy for the Fete on 6th July. We do hope that almost everyone will be able to join us for the Village Fete (hopefully in glorious sunshine!).

The rest of the term is looking very busy for staff and children. It has been lovely to share in the super work the children are doing and to see their enthusiasm for learning. Universal Infant Free School Meals

We understand that there may be a lack of clarity about the way the ordering and funding works for the free school meals provided for Reception and KS1 so would like to try to address this.

Funding – The government delegates funding to schools for these meals. We are <u>not</u> funded for the number of children on role in Reception and KS1. The amount of funding is based on an average of the number of meals **eaten** on two particular days – one in October and one in January. Due to variations in take up of our meals, data this year is such that we are predicting a probable funding shortfall of around £2000. This is one of the reasons we are careful to cancel any meals not needed – in this way we endeavour to cover any shortfall, and avoid spending the budget needed for teaching and learning.

Waste – We do not have a kitchen on site. Our caterers bring exact numbers of meals to the school each day. Any meals not needed end up wasted so we do our best to let them know accurate numbers. Wasting food does not fit with our eco-school ethos, nor with UK wide initiatives to care for the environment.

Ordering – As stated above, our caterers work to exact numbers to avoid waste. They order ingredients the week before serving so rely on accurate numbers to avoid wastage.

We hope this clarifies the way that the meals work in our school, and helps you to work with us to avoid any possible impact on our teaching and learning budget and any excessive wastage.

Dear Parents
