Thank you so much to all parents who completed a feedback form at the recent parent consultations. We received a total 84 responses; many with additional comments which are always appreciated as help put the scores in context.

Over 85% of respondents found the discussion(s) they had and the interim reports either 'very useful' or 'quite useful'. As a new feature to these parent consultations, the interim report was very much appreciated. In addition many parents commented how positive it was to have a face to face discussion, and that the overall environment felt more relaxed than previous years.

A third of respondents felt the governor's presence was 'very useful' and comments indicate that some parents don't know who the governors are nor fully understand their role. We are continuing to look at

ways we can address this - look out for a comprehensive update from the board about what we do after the Easter break.

As governors it's so important for us to gain parent feedback as this provides vital information for us to be able to fulfil our role in supporting the school. In the summer term we will be running our annual parent survey and we look forward to hearing more from you.
