

## CURRICULUM ENRICHMENT LEARNING 2022 - 2023

Our Curriculum Enrichment rotations cover a wide range of activities in which all children participate over the course of the year. This learning takes place in mixed class house groups which enables the children to develop their life skills in many areas including their confidence, resilience and engagement.

	Activity:	Key learning areas:
Reception and Year 1  <i>Enrichment to develop independence, curiosity, team-work</i>	Cookery	Hygiene; healthy diet; healthy choices and life skills. (Cutting and mixing.)
	Felt stitching	Life skills; perseverance and creativity; fine motor skills.
	Yoga	Confidence with physical body control; creativity; exploration; and mental well-being.
	Cultural dance	Memory; confidence; performance skills; cultural capital.
Year 2 and Year 3  <i>Enrichment to deepen understanding, independence, curiosity and perseverance</i>	Cookery	Seasonality; understanding where food comes from; healthy choices and life skills. (Use of sharp knives, mixing, some blending.)
	Coding	Creativity; exploring programming beyond the curriculum.
	Cross stitch	Life skills, perseverance and creativity; fine motor skills; and design.
	Natural Art	Team work; perseverance, resilience, and risk taking. (This builds on previous learning in art.)
Years 4, 5 and 6  <i>Enrichment to further deepen and embed understanding;</i>	Cookery	Nutrition and creating balanced meals; understanding where food comes from; healthy choices and life skills. (Use of a

	Forest School activities	Risk taking, fine motor control, independence and resilience.
	First Aid	Life skills; understanding of basic anatomy and physiology.
	Ukulele	Communication skills; fine motor control; perseverance; creativity and cultural capital.

Over the course of the year your child will participate in all the activities for their age group, working with different adults. Do ask your children about the activity they have been doing and the learning they have enjoyed.
