Dear Parents,

This will be the last newsletter of 2021 – where does the time go? This year has been almost as strange as 2020 and, despite the announcements yesterday, I am just hoping that we are all able to spend Christmas with our loved ones. Last year we sadly experienced a rapid changing picture in the last few days of term, which I am sure we all fervently hope will not be repeated.

The children's excitement for Christmas is already building, and it is lovely to have the post box for cards in operation. Please may I request that you check that your child has put their friends' full name and class on the envelope prior to posting.

I was so disappointed to be unable to attend the Y2 performance last Friday – I understand the children were fantastic, and the play was much enjoyed. I had certainly enjoyed listening to the songs drifting down the corridor. Tomorrow afternoon it is the turn of Y6, who have also been practising hard. We look forward to welcoming their parents to share the performance – please could Y6 parents who are planning to attend note the separate communication regarding safety measures. Thankfully school productions are still permitted to take place. However, we have sadly taken the decision not to go up to St Giles for our Carol Service. As you know we put in place additional protective measures two weeks ago and it is our current intention to keep these in place until the end of term to help to keep everyone as safe as possible. The situation will be reviewed in January when the children return to school.

Today the children have been taking part in a House Challenge. We had originally intended this to be managed by the House Captains with the children working in cross year group teams. However, we have instead kept the children in their House teams within their own class.
